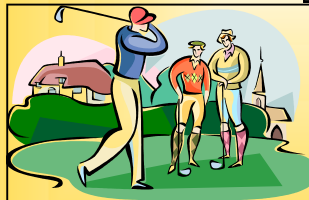
Our Meetings
